

## **Study 104: Isaiah, Part 60**

### **Isaiah 59**

<sup>15</sup> Truth is nowhere to be found,  
and whoever shuns evil becomes a prey.  
The Lord looked and was displeased  
that there was no justice.

<sup>16</sup> He saw that there was no one,  
he was appalled that there was no one to intervene; [i.e., none righteous to atone, intercede, or act as a mediator]  
**so his own arm achieved salvation for him,  
and his own righteousness sustained him.**

<sup>17</sup> **He put on righteousness as his breastplate,  
and the helmet of salvation on his head;** [cp. Eph 6:10-17]  
**he put on the garments of vengeance  
and wrapped himself in zeal as in a cloak.** [cp. Luke 21:22]

<sup>18</sup> **According to what they have done,  
so will he repay  
wrath to his enemies  
and retribution to his foes;** [cp. Matt 16:27; Rev 19:11-13; 22:12]  
he will repay the islands their due.

<sup>19</sup> From the west, people will fear the name of the Lord,  
and from the rising of the sun, they will revere his glory.  
For he will come like a pent-up flood [*He* may be referring to the Lord]  
that the breath of the Lord drives along.<sup>[a]</sup>

<sup>20</sup> **“The Redeemer will come to Zion,  
to those in Jacob who repent of their sins,”** [cp. Rom 11:26]  
declares the Lord.

<sup>21</sup> “As for me, this is my covenant with them,” says the Lord. “My Spirit, who is on you, will not depart from you, and my words that I have put in your mouth will always be on your lips, on the lips of your children and on the lips of their descendants—from this time on and forever,” says the Lord.

### **Isaiah 60**

“Arise, shine, for your light has come,  
and the glory of the Lord rises upon you.

<sup>2</sup> See, darkness covers the earth  
and thick darkness is over the peoples,  
but the Lord rises upon you  
and his glory appears over you.

<sup>3</sup> Nations will come to your light,  
and kings to the brightness of your dawn.

<sup>4</sup> “Lift up your eyes and look about you:  
All assemble and come to you;  
your sons come from afar,  
and your daughters are carried on the hip.

<sup>5</sup> Then you will look and be radiant,  
your heart will throb and swell with joy;  
the wealth on the seas will be brought to you,  
to you the riches of the nations will come.

### **[cp. Rev 21:**

Then I saw “a new heaven and a new earth,”<sup>[a]</sup> for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and there was no longer any sea.<sup>2</sup> I saw the Holy City, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared

as a bride beautifully dressed for her husband.<sup>3</sup> And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, “Look! God’s dwelling place is now among the people, and he will dwell with them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God.”<sup>4</sup> “He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death<sup>[b]</sup> or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away.”

<sup>5</sup> He who was seated on the throne said, “I am making everything new!” Then he said, “Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true.”

<sup>6</sup> He said to me: “It is done. I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End. To the thirsty I will give water without cost from the spring of the water of life.<sup>7</sup> Those who are victorious will inherit all this, and I will be their God and they will be my children.<sup>8</sup> But the cowardly, the unbelieving, the vile, the murderers, the sexually immoral, those who practice magic arts, the idolaters and all liars—they will be consigned to the fiery lake of burning sulfur. This is the second death.”

<sup>9</sup> One of the seven angels who had the seven bowls full of the seven last plagues came and said to me, “Come, I will show you the bride, the wife of the Lamb.”<sup>10</sup> And he carried me away in the Spirit to a mountain great and high, and showed me the Holy City, Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God.<sup>11</sup> It shone with the glory of God, and its brilliance was like that of a very precious jewel, like a jasper, clear as crystal.<sup>12</sup> It had a great, high wall with twelve gates, and with twelve angels at the gates. On the gates were written the names of the twelve tribes of Israel.<sup>13</sup> There were three gates on the east, three on the north, three on the south and three on the west.<sup>14</sup> The wall of the city had twelve foundations, and on them were the names of the twelve apostles of the Lamb.

<sup>15</sup> The angel who talked with me had a measuring rod of gold to measure the city, its gates and its walls.<sup>16</sup> The city was laid out like a square, as long as it was wide. He measured the city with the rod and found it to be 12,000 stadia<sup>[c]</sup> in length, and as wide and high as it is long.<sup>17</sup> The angel measured the wall using human measurement, and it was 144 cubits<sup>[d]</sup> thick.<sup>[e]</sup><sup>18</sup> The wall was made of jasper, and the city of pure gold, as pure as glass.<sup>19</sup> The foundations of the city walls were decorated with every kind of precious stone. The first foundation was jasper, the second sapphire, the third agate, the fourth emerald,<sup>20</sup> the fifth onyx, the sixth ruby, the seventh chrysolite, the eighth beryl, the ninth topaz, the tenth turquoise, the eleventh jacinth, and the twelfth amethyst.<sup>[f]</sup><sup>21</sup> The twelve gates were twelve pearls, each gate made of a single pearl. The great street of the city was of gold, as pure as transparent glass.

<sup>22</sup> I did not see a temple in the city, because the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb are its temple.<sup>23</sup> The city does not need the sun or the moon to shine on it, for the glory of God gives it light, and the Lamb is its lamp.<sup>24</sup> The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their splendor into it.<sup>25</sup> On no day will its gates ever be shut, for there will be no night there.<sup>26</sup> The glory and honor of the nations will be brought into it.<sup>27</sup> Nothing impure will ever enter it, nor will anyone who does what is shameful or deceitful, but only those whose names are written in the Lamb’s book of life.

young camels of Midian and Ephah.  
And all from Sheba will come,  
bearing gold and incense  
and proclaiming the praise of the Lord.

<sup>7</sup> All Kedar’s flocks will be gathered to you,  
the rams of Nebaioth will serve you;

they will be accepted as offerings on my altar,  
and I will adorn my glorious temple.

<sup>8</sup>“Who are these that fly along like clouds,  
like doves to their nests?

<sup>9</sup>Surely the islands look to me;  
in the lead are the ships of Tarshish,<sup>[a]</sup>  
bringing your children from afar,  
with their silver and gold,  
to the honor of the Lord your God,  
the Holy One of Israel,  
for he has endowed you with splendor.

<sup>10</sup>“Foreigners will rebuild your walls,  
and their kings will serve you.  
Though in anger I struck you,  
in favor I will show you compassion.

<sup>11</sup>Your gates will always stand open,  
they will never be shut, day or night,  
so that people may bring you the wealth of the nations—  
their kings led in triumphal procession.

<sup>12</sup>For the nation or kingdom that will not serve you will perish;  
it will be utterly ruined.

<sup>13</sup>“The glory of Lebanon will come to you,  
the juniper, the fir and the cypress together,  
to adorn my sanctuary;  
and I will glorify the place for my feet.

<sup>14</sup>The children of your oppressors will come bowing before you;  
all who despise you will bow down at your feet  
and will call you the City of the Lord,  
Zion of the Holy One of Israel.

<sup>15</sup>“Although you have been forsaken and hated,  
with no one traveling through,  
I will make you the everlasting pride  
and the joy of all generations.

<sup>16</sup>You will drink the milk of nations  
and be nursed at royal breasts.  
Then you will know that I, the Lord, am your Savior,  
your Redeemer, the Mighty One of Jacob.

<sup>17</sup>Instead of bronze I will bring you gold,  
and silver in place of iron.  
Instead of wood I will bring you bronze,  
and iron in place of stones.  
I will make peace your governor  
and well-being your ruler.

<sup>18</sup>No longer will violence be heard in your land,  
nor ruin or destruction within your borders,  
but you will call your walls Salvation  
and your gates Praise.

<sup>19</sup>The sun will no more be your light by day,  
nor will the brightness of the moon shine on you,  
for the Lord will be your everlasting light,  
and your God will be your glory.

<sup>20</sup>Your sun will never set again,  
and your moon will wane no more;  
the Lord will be your everlasting light,  
and your days of sorrow will end.

<sup>21</sup>Then all your people will be righteous

and they will possess the land forever.  
They are the shoot I have planted,  
the work of my hands,  
for the display of my splendor.  
<sup>22</sup>The least of you will become a thousand,  
the smallest a mighty nation.  
I am the Lord;  
in its time I will do this swiftly.”
